The Appellant most humbly submits the following points for the consideration of this Hon'ble Commission:

1. Core Issue: Continued Evasion of the Lekhpal's Report

The primary issue remains Lekhpal's failure to submit the partition (Faat) report as ordered by the Court of the Additional Officer on **September 13, 2024**. Although the PIO's latest letter dated **April 15, 2026**, mentions the restoration of the case (New Case No. D202616530000493), it remains silent on whether the Lekhpal has actually submitted the report. The status of the litigation is not a substitute for the information sought regarding administrative accountability.

2. Non-Compliance with Official Communication Standards

- **Informal WhatsApp Delivery:** The PIO sent the latest response today, **April 15, 2026**, via WhatsApp—just 24 hours before the Commission hearing. This is a recurring tactic to prevent the Appellant from studying the response properly before the hearing.

- **Failure to Use Registered Email:** Despite the Appellant's email address (yogimpsingh@gmail.com) being on the record, the PIO has failed to send a formal, signed PDF to this official address.

□

- **Contested Timestamps:** In previous instances, the PIO claimed delivery on **February 17, 2026**, but digital evidence proved it was actually sent on

February 20, 2026, showing a clear attempt to mislead the Commission regarding timelines.

3. Suppression of Accountability

The RTI sought the names and designations of officials who allowed a 12-month delay in court proceedings. The information provided today (April 15) again avoids these five specific points and focuses only on the court's current schedule.

4. Prayer for Relief

In light of this documented negligence, the Appellant prays that:

1. **Penalty:** A maximum penalty of **₹25,000** be imposed on the PIO under **Section 20(1)** for deliberate delay and providing misleading statements.
2. **Point-wise Direction:** The PIO is strictly directed to answer why the Lekhpal disobeyed a judicial order for over 12 months.
3. **Official Record:** The PIO is ordered to communicate only through the registered email address or by post, rather than through unverified WhatsApp accounts.
